Course Description/Rationale: Individual instruction. One hour credit for one hour lesson per week. May be repeated for credit. Recital performance required.

Concord University Educational Goal(s): This course addresses all Concord University Educational Goals.

Learning Outcomes: Students will be able to play scales, scale etudes, instrument specific etudes and repertoire considered standard to their level, compared to other colleges/universities. Students will be expected to complete the above with the following accuracies: instrument/interdisciplinary majors – 90%; education majors or instrument/interdisciplinary minor – 80%; non-music majors/minors 70%.

Course Requirements: Students will be expected to keep a practice record. Whether this is on paper or by mp3 is at the teacher's discretion. Students who do not keep an acceptable record by drop day will be dropped. Music-education majors or instrument/interdisciplinary minors will be expected to practice 7-14 hours per week; instrument/interdisciplinary majors will be expected to practice 14 hours per week. Non-music majors/minors will be expected to practice 7 hours per week, and will not be allowed to pass beyond a junior standing level. Also see "Learning Outcomes."

Grading Policy and Scale, Make-up Policy, Late Work: 25% - percent of expected hours practiced; 5% - being prepared for lesson (students must have materials, including assignment sheet); 20% - achievement/accuracy on scale etudes; 25% - achievement/accuracy on instrument specific etudes; 25% - achievement/accuracy on repertoire. All the above may be overridden by a jury score.
